REFERENDUM FORUM WEBCAST RULES

- Those individuals and groups in good standing who registered with the Monitor to advocate in support of either side of the Referendum question (“Referendum Advocates”) by September 22, 2021, and who submitted the required Declaration in Connection with Registration for Referendum Advocacy to the Monitor and signed up to participate in the Referendum Forum webcast (the “Referendum Forum”) by **September 30, 2021**, shall be permitted to speak during the Referendum Forum according to the procedures described herein.
- The Referendum Forum will take place via Zoom videoconference on **October 7, 2021, and will begin promptly at 6 p.m. ET**. As set forth in further detail below, the Referendum Forum will also be broadcast over YouTube, and recorded and posted to the Monitor’s website, www.uawmonitor.com/electionsreferendum, so that all UAW members who wish to view the webinar may do so at their convenience.
- All Referendum Advocates must provide the Monitor team with the email address associated with their Zoom account that they will use to join the webinar. This is important to ensure that Referendum Advocates are granted access to the Zoom webinar as panelists. Referendum Advocates must log on using that same Zoom account on the day of the program.
- Referendum Advocates will be provided login information needed to access the videoconference as a panelist, along with a copy of the Referendum Forum Webcast Rules, prior to the Referendum Forum start time.
- The login information to access the Referendum Forum will also be posted to the Monitor’s website, at www.uawmonitor.com/electionsreferendum.
- Referendum Advocates must log in to the Referendum Forum **by 5:45 p.m. ET on October 7, 2021**, in order to check-in with the Monitor and confirm that they have reviewed and agree to the Referendum Forum Webcast Rules.

- A tech test will be held in advance of the Referendum Forum. The Monitor team will communicate the date and time of the tech test to Referendum Advocates separately. All Referendum Advocates are highly encouraged to attend the tech test, although it is not required.
- At the outset of the Referendum Forum, the Monitor will offer brief remarks and then each Referendum Advocate will be allotted two (2) minutes and no more to speak in support of the side of the Referendum question for which the Referendum Advocate indicated support when registering with the Monitor. The order of speakers will be determined by the Monitor and provided to the Referendum Advocates at least 24 hours before the Referendum Forum begins. Depending on time, the Monitor may take questions via the Zoom's chat function at the end of the Forum.
- Only one individual will be permitted to speak at the Referendum Forum on behalf of any group registered collectively as a Referendum Advocate.
- Any Referendum Advocate wishing to use a visual aid during his or her allotted speaking time must submit such material to the Monitor for approval at UAWMonitor-Election@jenner.com at least 72 hours prior to the start time of the Referendum Forum.
- When not speaking, all Referendum Advocates must mute their microphones. The Referendum Forum is not a debate and Referendum Advocates are prohibited from interrupting other speakers during their allotted speaking times.
- As per the Second Interim Rules, any improper advocacy, as defined by the Monitor, and expressly including any threats, intimidation, retaliation, penalty, discipline or improper interference or reprisal of any kind, or any similar conduct is strictly prohibited.
- The Referendum Forum will be moderated by a member of the Monitor team (the "Moderator"). The Moderator may limit or suspend a Referendum Advocate's speaking time if in his or her discretion the Referendum Advocate engages in inappropriate conduct or conduct that violates the Referendum Forum Webcast Rules or the Second Interim Rules.
- As noted above, the Referendum Forum will be recorded and posted to the Monitor's website, www.uawmonitor.com/electionsreferendum.
